What can you do with Uwazi?



Collect & Categorise

- Data can include loose text, images, various media files and documents
- Add context, create templates to categorise
- Use relationships to track complex cases



Store & Analyse

- Store large amount of information
- Decide what is public or private
- Search and filter subsets
- Analyse content with graphics, tables & maps



Collaborate & Protect

- Gather information from public forms
- Choose what you want to share
- Monitor changes made in the database
- Add extra layers of security



Assess & Showcase

- Build a public version
- Tell stories with data
- Export information to an interoperable format
- Privately share for advocacy, litigation & accountability
